Community Conversations is a bi-annual community discussion forum on dominant community topics such as the housing shortage, public safety, etc. These events are open to the community and in the style of a panel Q&A.

#### **NOVEMBER 15TH**

The fist Community Conversations featured former county and city attorney, and recent facilitator of the county's Justice Response Committee, Margie Rice. The topic of discussion was perspectives on the role of law enforcement, the business community, public health groups, and criminal justice academics on strategies to improve the current system.

#### **APRIL 4TH**

The second Community Conversations of the year was also facilitated and held by Margie Rice. The topic for this event was outlining challenges associated with important local issues related to housing, criminal justice reform, and the convention center expansion project.





## **ABOUT THE AWARDS**

Each year The Chamber's Success School, a program designed to connect the business community with local schools and students, hosts a celebration of educators. The Educator of the Year Awards recognizes local teachers, administrators and/or staff, as well as educational programs, at a special dinner and awards presentation.
